CAUTION! FAILURE TO FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS MAY CAUSE INJURY!

Co2 goes into solution best when both Co2 and solution are cold. Likewise, Co2 tends to come out of solution under warmer conditions (or outgas). Understanding this will insure successful use of **the** carbonater valve coupling.

DIRECTIONS:

•TO PRESERVE A CARBONATED BEVERAGE:

1. Fill clean PLASTIC soda bottle with CHILLED beverage. 2. Do not splash liquid & try not to aerate. (Brewers—attach a plastic hose from tap—insert from bottle—extending 'tap' to bottom) 3. Leave approx. 3" of air space at top of neck. 4. Attach the carbonater valve coupling to the plastic soda bottle. 5. Depress valve on the carbonater and squeeze plastic soda bottle until all air is purged and liquid starts to escape. 6. Attach CO: connector—turn on—inject Co2 into bottle. DO NOT EXCEED 40 P.S.I. Remove connector—you have now preserved a carbonated beverage.

•TO CARBONATE A STILL BEVERAGE:

Follow steps 1 thru 6 before continuing. 7. Shake vigorously. Repeat steps 6 & 7 until desired "carbonation is achieved or until the plastic soda bottle stays 'hard.' 8. Chill overnight. 9. Refrigeration MAY 'soften' bottle—simply repeat step 6 if necessary. 10.20-30 P.S.I. is the optimum CO; pressure and achieves the best results.

•WARNINGS:

Although plastic soda bottles are very durable, great caution must be exercised when using the carbonater as with any pressurized vessel.

1. **NEVER** use on glass bottles
2. **NEVER** use more than 40 P.S.I.
3. **RELIEVE PRESSURE** by depressing center valve before removing from container.
4. Regularly EXAMINE working condition of complete system.
5. **REPLACE any** worn or broken item before using.
6. **DO NOT** let cold carbonated beverages become too warm. CO; pressure increases dramatically with temperature increase.
7. **NEVER** point unit at anyone, including operator.
8. Remove the carbonater slowly.
9. **DO NOT** over-tighten.
10. **REPLACE** plastic soda bottles often.
11. **PLEASE** wear safety goggles.
